Dear Dr. Winter, I am 28 and have big tori by my tongue, which are those bumps of bone. I have noticed my teeth are weak and I have lost two teeth recently. Is that because of my mandibular tori? I have no insurance so haven't gone to the dentist but now I am having a crisis as these two missing teeth show when I smile. Help!

Dear Jennifer, tori wouldn't be the reason for you to lose teeth. If you have lost teeth it is a sign you have either severe decay or periodontal disease or both. You need to address this to avoid loss of additional teeth. As to dental insurance it usually only covers up to \$1000 per year so is only there for small problems. We offer interest free financing to help people afford dentistry even if they don't have insurance. In fact, avoiding dentistry due to cost can lead to much more extensive and expensive dentistry so it is always better to take care of problems when they are small.

Dear Dr. Winter, I am in the process of having a partial made with a "clip" attachment. I am interested in seeing if I can use "mini-implants" for an attachment rather than clips. My dentist doesn't do implants (standard or mini), and has indicated that the partial can't be sustained by mini implants. He says the only way mini implants can be used is with a full denture.

Dear John, 40-60% of partials end up in a drawer within 3 year of being made. That is because they move, lift up and can cause food impaction after meals. They can lead to loosening of the teeth they are clipped to as well as bone loss over time. Mini-implants are certainly an option to stabilize these dentures assuming there is enough bone to place these devices. Precision attachments are connected to roots or crowns and give the partial denture something to hook on to. Mini-implants are another option and can be used if traditional implants cannot be done due to lack of bone or proximity to nerve structures. Your dentist may not be familiar with this use for mini dental implants.
